STUDY ABROAD






ENGLISH LANGUAGE SUPPORT

We require all international undergraduate applicants to have a minimum IELTS score of 6.0 overall, including 5.5 in academic writing, or an equivalent qualification. There are some courses which require higher IELTS (or equivalent) and this will be clearly indicated in the entry requirements on our website. Please note, the UKVI have their own English language requirements so please check the Government website.





ANIMAL SCIENCE AND WELFARE

Positively contribute to the advancement of animal welfare and bring about a better world.

One of the University's core values is Compassion – for people, animals and the planet. Our Animal Welfare and Animal Science courses encourage you to explore modern concepts of animal welfare, while considering the relationships between humans and other animals, from whether we should consume animals to the human causes of biodiversity loss.

You will examine animal welfare across multiple scenarios involving both domestic and exotic species, in captive and wild contexts, while the broad scope and thought-provoking content enables you to discover and develop your areas of interest, with optional modules allowing further specialism.

Our animal-focused degrees either allow you to critically question the place of animals in human society or to investigate human impacts on ecosystems, wild-living animals and those managed in captivity. We explore animal welfare by examining the biology of animal wellbeing and suffering. From a humanities or science perspective students are encouraged to find solutions to today's animal welfare and conservation crises.

BA (Hons) Animal Welfare and Society is an on campus multidisciplinary degree which investigates human-animal interaction through a range of perspectives including animal behaviour, animal welfare science, ethics, religion, politics and sociology.

BSc (Hons) Animal Science and Conservation is a natural science-based degree which critically examines the relationships between animal welfare science, conservation biology and environmental sustainability, following a planetary health/one welfare approach. This is a distance learning degree delivered entirely online.

Through practical modules or work placement opportunities you will be able to develop key employability skills, or experience working with leading animal organisations. These courses will allow you to take advantage of a diverse international job market.

Graduates may go on to become employed in commercial, charity or government sectors as charity officers; conservation scientists; sustainability advisors; welfare and rehoming officers; and training and behaviour advisors.

ANTHROPOLOGY

If you enjoy delving into the bare bones of what it means to be human, then Anthropology at Winchester is ideal for you.

Through the lens of social anthropology, biological anthropology and archaeology/ material culture, you will embark on a fascinating exploration of human behaviours and societies across the past and present.

Modules draw on archaeological evidence, the long-term perspective of human evolution and present-day examples from societies around the world.

You can get up close and hands-on with a range of materials, from primate skeletons to religious relics in our cutting-edge departmental laboratory. You also have the opportunity to undertake a work placement in Year 3, and as part of the course you will

build experience with anthropological fieldwork techniques and will be encouraged to develop your own fieldwork interests.


As an Anthropology student, you learn how to understand, interpret and respond to human behaviour. Our courses develop your intercultural understanding which is a key asset in today's international job market.

Gain the necessary skills to gather, analyse and interpret archaeological evidence to truly bring the past to life and conserve it for future generations.

You will learn from world-leading archaeology scholars in a stimulating and engaging environment. We offer you the perfect blend of academic study with hands-on, practical fieldwork where you can use innovative scientific techniques, the latest range of field equipment and our fully-equipped laboratory. You will have access to specialist computer software such as ArcGIS and Geoplot.

Our department has a commercial research consultancy (ARCA) which offers valuable laboratory work experience – an

opportunity to combine your academic expertise with delivering high-quality commercial solutions.

As well as working on fieldwork sites in the UK, previous students have been to Barbados, Corsica, Georgia, Belgium and Greece – and one of our courses includes a full year's professional placement:

BSc (Hons) Archaeological Practice with Professional Placement.

Explore the fundamental design principles, analysing how places can affect our mood and the relationship between humans and buildings – how we interact with them, use them, and feel about them.

Project-based work will be in our state-of-the-art studio, focusing on the humanities, technical skills, digital resources, and creative design. At each turn, we will urge you to ask important questions of your design. How can we use design to respond to the needs of a society? What materials are the friendliest to our planet without compromising safety and longevity?

Lecturers, including leading industry professionals, will work with you to cement your architectural concepts and make them a reality.

Outside of the University, the city of Winchester itself is regularly voted as one of the best places to live in the UK and is laced with heritage, nature, and tradition. From Georgian and Victorian properties to the majestic Winchester Cathedral, you will be surrounded by sources of inspiration.

BIOMEDICAL SCIENCE

Be at the forefront of a scientific career in healthcare.

Biomedical scientists stand at the core of our health and wellbeing. We can thank them for breakthroughs such as the coronavirus vaccine and for enforcing action through their informed clinical decisions. If this sounds like something you want to become, Winchester can help you get there.

Our course provides a contemporary approach to teaching and learning in the key biomedical science areas of human anatomy, physiology, cellular and molecular pathology, microbiology, immunology, haematology, as well as biochemistry, nutrition, metabolism and pharmacology. You will gain experience of working safely in a laboratory and be equipped with the skills required to plan and conduct experiments, and analyse and evaluate data

Our team of expert lecturers and training staff will help to place your learning into context. We also have guest lecturers who are practising biomedical scientists and clinicians who provide networking opportunities and a solid basis for planning your career.

If you're looking to become a biomedical scientist, the options after graduating are rich and varied.

Graduates will become highly employable and may go on to be analytical chemists; biomedical scientists; biotechnologists; clinical scientists in biochemistry, genomics, haematology or immunology; forensic scientists; medicinal chemists; microbiologists; physician associates; medical research scientists; or toxicologists. You could also go on to study at Masters level, enter a research career or the medical profession.

ENGLISH

Embark on an enthralling, international journey exploring the language or literature of English, in all its rich diversity and guirkiness.

Whether you're interested in the study of texts or the use and evolution of language, our courses are designed to spark your imagination, sharpen your written communication skills and encourage you to think critically.

Our English Literature courses develop your skills of critical analysis, research, and writing, through the study of a wide range of fiction, poetry, and drama from across historical periods. You will study early literature in its context, explore boundaries between literature and other types of texts like films, and have modules on poetry and world literature. There is also lots of choice, so you can focus on genres and movements that interest you, for example globalisation and contemporary fiction, Chaucer and his world or children's literature.



You will be taught by a team of film specialists and industry professionals with different backgrounds, whose diverse research expertise is reflected in the breadth and scope of the curriculum.



Giving you exposure to real-life cases, our topical, lively courses equip you with wide-ranging expertise.

You will benefit from interactive and practical teaching approaches that bring theory to life and offer genuine insight into these fascinating fields.

With a focus on professional employability, our courses offer you the chance to review cases as part of our live Justice Project or our Cold Case Unit. You will engage with key issues, learn forensic detection methods and review applied investigative techniques.

Our extensive forensic facilities enable you to learn important practical and technical skills. These include a new teaching laboratory, a research laboratory, a state-of-the-art linguistics laboratory, a dedicated crime scene house for setting up mock crime scenes, and a DEFRA-licensed taphonomic facility for carrying out decomposition research.

All three courses cover core modules in forensic evidence, crime scene investigation, DNA analysis and court room skills. In addition, each of the programmes cover specific core modules: BSc (Hons) Forensic Investigation includes criminology modules; BSc (Hons) Forensic Investigation and Cyber Security includes computer technology modules; and BSc (Hons) Forensic Science includes some chemistry-based modules such as toxicology. You can therefore choose the course which best suits your personal skills and interests.

Graduates may go on to become crime scene investigators; forensic laboratory analysts; police officers and digital analysts; customs and excise officers; prison and probation service caseworkers; cyber security analysts; and medical/pathology laboratory assistants.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

GCSE English and Maths

All our courses require all our students to have a minimum of a Grade 4/C in GCSE English Language and GCSE Mathematics, or a suitable equivalent qualification.

English language requirements for international students

We require all international undergraduate applicants to have a minimum of IELTS 6.0 (including 5.5 in academic writing) or equivalent. There are some courses which require higher IELTS – please see relevant symbol below. We offer foundation and short pre-sessional programmes to improve your English ability prior to arrival, as well as in-sessional support alongside your main course of study, if you wish to improve your English language skills. Other qualifications
