PFH Student Journey

Application and Admission

- Application is automatically insert into CRM System
- Admission checks documents, sends aptitude test (applies only for Management studies) and plans personal interview with professors/academic staff

Study contract and financial guide sent

- Admission issues study contract and financial guide (in case of Master's Foundation Programme also the supplementary agreement)
- Admission asks applicant to sign contract (and supplementary agreement) and pay 2,500 EUR deposit (proportionate share of 1st semester tuition fees)
- In case of Visa rejection, the student will get a refund of the paid amount except 250 Euros.

Signed study contract (and supplementary agreement) and payment received

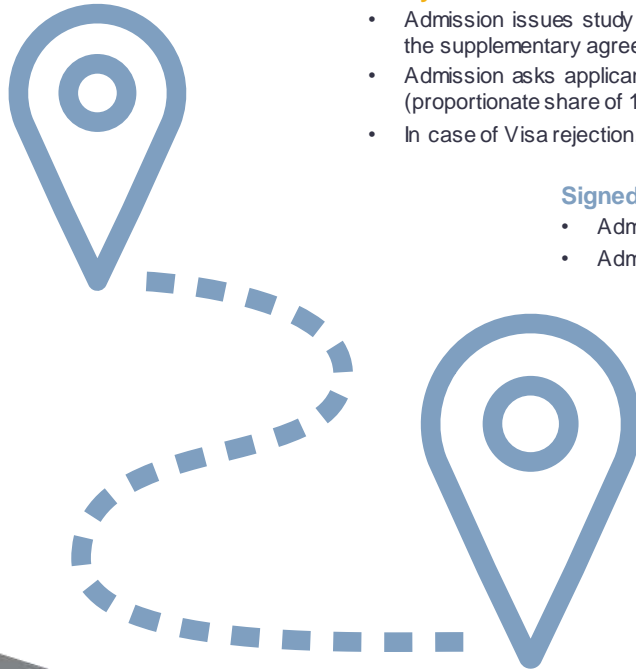
- Admission issues the CoA (Confirmation of Acceptance) and CoP (Confirmation of Payment)
- Admission sends back countersigned contract (and countersigned supplementary agreement), CoA and CoP

Enrollment

- Admission forwards student details to International Office, Study Coordination and Accounting
- International Office sends information about Accommodation, Visa, Health Insurance, Student Buddy programme (applies for students at Göttingen Campus), and more
- Student details insert into virtual campus (MyPFH)
- Rest of the first semester tuition fee needs to be paid before semester start

Start of Study at PFH

- Student has to bring documents to campus (Original Bachelor Certificate, Proof of Health Insurance)
- Matriculation Certificate is issued
- Latest arrival date on campus: two weeks after the beginning of orientation week

- Language proficiency – IELTS 6.5
- Copy of passport

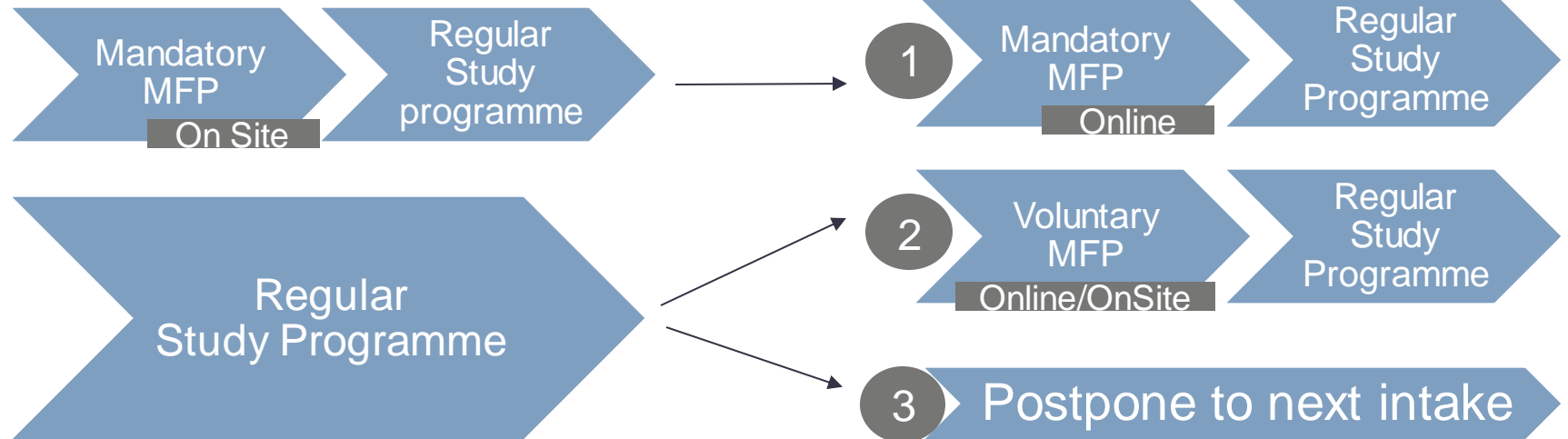
What is MFP?

- PFH offers a **Master's Foundation Programme (MFP)**, which enables students, who otherwise might **not have enough study credits** - especially in the business field, to get accepted for the master's degree in General Management.
- With this foundation programme, students acquire the knowledge needed to pursue our master's degree in General Management. This means that students **with no academic background in management, business or the like** can apply for it. It is designed entirely as a distance learning programme, **reducing the cost per semester by 50%**.

- Hamburg just a short train ride away

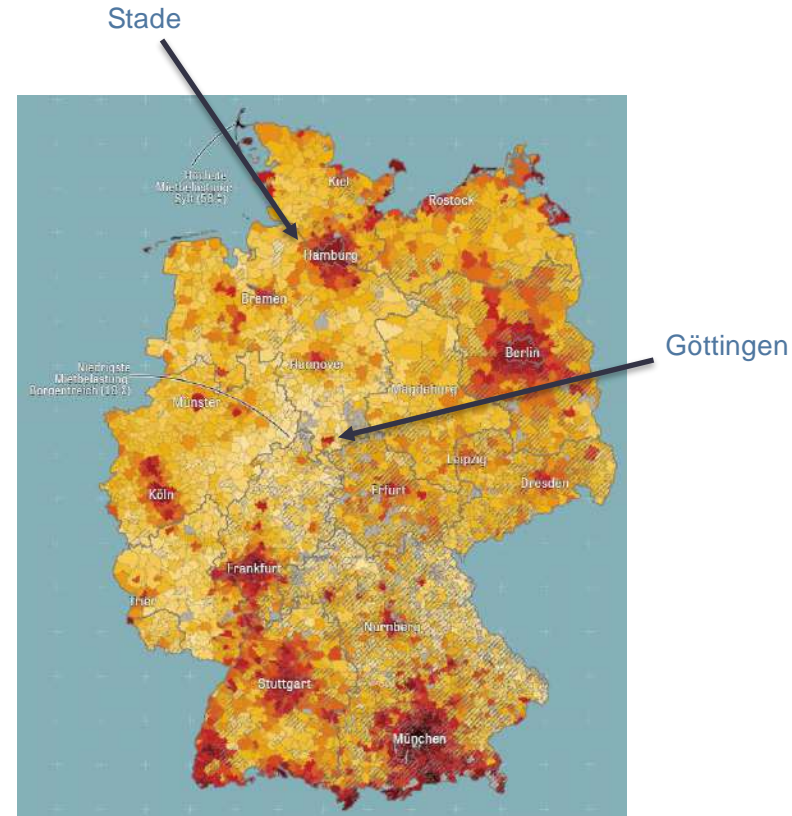


Campus Stade and the Composites United

Student Life in Germany - Accommodation

- Accommodation is not automatically assigned
- Shared flat = lower costs

Student Life in Germany

Working during studies

- Compulsory internships
- No special permit to work required
- Beyond that, you are allowed to work for
 - 120 full days (8 hours)
 - 240 half days (4 hours) per year
- Secondary student activities (tutor or student assistant) are allowed without any restrictions
- Cooperation with company for thesis (mainly master's)

Working after studies

- Current law: 18-month work permit after degree
- After that, Working Permit or EU Blue Card possible:
 - at least income is around 50,000 euros gross per year
